Dear Merchants and Friends,

The Puerto Rican Cultural Center Juan Antonio Corretjer is proudly celebrating the 38th annual Puerto Rican People's Parade on Division St. -Paseo Boricua. (1978-2016)

This year the Parade is dedicated to the 50th anniversary of the Puerto Rican Parade of Chicago (1966-2016) and the Divisions Street Puerto Rican Rebellion of 1966.

On June 12, 1966, the first Puerto Rican Parade of Chicago took place in Downtown organized by the Caballeros de San Juan. On that same day, the Chicago police shot a young Puerto Rican man which lead to the Division Street Riots of 1966- lasting almost three days.

In the 1960's the Puerto Rican people faced high levels of discrimination, poor education, displacement, poverty and exclusion. The police shooting of that young man provoked convulsions in the Puerto Rican community, in such a dramatic way, that it resulted in the rebellion of 1966. This uprising, by the Puerto Rican people, focused much needed attention by the City of Chicago and elected officials who then began to take notice. Following the riots, Puerto Rican leaders organized meetings and forums to address community problems head on. This eventually lead to the establishment of organizations and institutions such as: the Spanish Action Committee of Chicago, the Young Lords Organization, ASPIRA of Illinois, Bickerdike Redevelopment Corporation, Spanish Coalition for Housing; Segundo Ruiz Belvis Cultural Center, the Puerto Rican Cultural Center, El Rincón, José de Diego Bilingual Center the opening of Roberto Clemente High School, Proyecto Pa'lante at NEIU, LARES at UIC, the Dr. Pedro Albizu Campos Puerto Rican HS among others.

1966 was a turning point for the Puerto Rican community; a tragedy became the birth of opportunities and achievements. Please join us as we celebrate these milestones.

I RULES & REGULATIONS

1) ENTRY FEES:

Select your entry choice from the following:

Corporate: before May 22, \$3,000.00 after May 22, \$3,000.00 Political before May 22, 450.00 after May 22, \$550.00 Small Business: before May 22, \$550.00 after May 22, \$650.00

Non-Profit: before May 22, \$450.00 after May 22, \$550.00 (Must provide copy of (501(c)3 letter)

Groups before May 22, \$300.00 for 20 after May 22, \$400.00 for 20 Cars before May 22, \$200.00 for 10 After May 22, \$300.00 for 10 Motorcycle before May 22, \$250.00 for 10 after May 22, \$300. for 10

Bicycle Clubs before May 22, \$150.00 after May 22, \$250. (unlimited Riders)

2) TYPE of ENTRY:

Participants can register a marching group, one truck, float, or a group of 20 cars or motorcycles.

3) LINEUP & CHECK-IN PROCEDURES:

- a) LINE-UP on the westbound lane of Division Street West of Western Ave. (Dr. Pedro Albizu Campos Street)
- b) CHECK-IN 9:00AM 1:45PM, People's Parade Committee table at the front of the parade (corner of Division & Western)

4) RULES:

As stated previously - before Parade Day, make sure that all participants from your group know and understand the rules listed. These apply to the parade line-up and the route.

The following use of items and behavior are PROHIBITED by City Ordinance and/or Federal Law:

- a) Alcoholic beverages
- b) Controlled substances
- c) Nudity
- d) Jumping on and off floats or vehicles, and endangering participants.
- e) Floats and other vehicles that experience mechanical difficulties during the parade cannot be abandoned. Safely push stalled vehicles to the side of the street to allow others to proceed around them.

5) PARADE PACE PROCESSION:

The pace is established by People's Parade. All registrants should be at their entry position and ready to step off at the official starting time 2:00PM. Failure to do so can result in assignment to another spot. PRCC People's Parade reserves the right to change line-up to our own discretion.

MONITORS: all parade registrants will follow the lead of the parade monitors. Their job is to ensure that your entry follows the rules, moves steadily down the route and when necessary, politely urge spectators to stay on the curbs.

6. STEP-OFF:

Begin at Division St. & Western Ave. 2:00PM (Dr. Pedro Albizu Campos Street), west on Division Street South on Kedzie Ave. Disbanding on Kedzie between Division and Augusta. SINCE PARADE TAKES PLACE RAIN OR SHINE THERE ARE NO REFUNDS.
